

2022-23 marks a remarkable academic year for EcoSchools from coast to coast. This year, 1,641 schools from across Canada registered in the EcoSchools program. We were thrilled to welcome 173 new schools to the EcoSchools community from 10 provinces and territories.

We added two new actions to the ECA this year: Zero-Emission Vehicles and Low-Carbon Driving, and Climate Hero Escape Room. Here are some of the highlights from these new actions for 2022-23:



**100% of participating schools** increased their awareness of how students and adults can take positive action related to fuel-efficiency, eco-driving, clean fuels, and fuel diversification.



**3,767 students** increased their awareness of the global climate crisis, in a fun and immersive online escape room game experience.
